



Originally built in 1766, Harvard Hall has had many major renovations, including a renovation and addition in 1870 by Ware and Van Brunt. It now serves as a main classroom building centrally located on Harvard's campus.

Our fast-tracked renovation of the building's interior included adding an elevator (which required significant structural work), reconfiguring the lobby (replicating shiplap wainscoting from 19th-century photographs), improving egress systems (adding a second egress stair), and upgrading five large undergraduate classrooms.
